Ash Wednesday is this Wednesday 17th February: The Beginning of Our Lenten Journey. This year we cannot gather to receive the ashes at mass. Instead, blessed ashes will be available in Killeen Church after 9.30am mass and in Tynagh Church from 10.45am, along with a prayer card. I invite you to call to either church during Wednesday, and take an envelope with blessed ashes in it, for distribution with your family at home.

Lent: Lent is one of the most significant seasons of the Liturgical Year. It originated from the time of preparation by those preparing for baptism at Easter. Eventually, it became a time for the whole Christian community to review and renew their lives in advance of Easter. Consisting of forty days (Sundays excluded), the season of Lent is modelled on the forty days spent by Jesus fasting in the desert prior to beginning his public ministry.

Fasting, Prayer and Giving to the Poor: Fasting. Praying. Giving to the poor are important Lenten duties. Fasting is reducing one's intake of food or the giving up of something. It reminds us that we must sacrifice ourselves to put God and others first in life. Linked to fasting is abstinence. In Ireland, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are traditionally days of fast and abstinence. People can take on things for Lent. Give more time in prayer, more time caring for others or giving to the poor. Prayer deepens our relationship with God while giving to the poor reminds us of caring for others most in need.

Lenten Prayer Guide: A specially prepared diocesan prayer guide is now available at www.clonfertdiocese.ie to assist you and your family in making Ash Wednesday and the Sundays of Lent a spiritually enriching experience.

Trócaire: The annual Trócaire Lenten Collection is an important source of funding for our Catholic Development Agency. It helps those who are suffering from poverty, a lack of medicine and education in many of the poorest countries in the world. Please pick up a Trócaire Box from the church porch and use it as part of your giving to the less well off this Lent.

Covid-19 Vaccination: The Irish bishops encourage people to support the Covid-19 vaccination programme, "not only for their own good, but for the protection of life and the health of those who are vulnerable and for the common good of humanity.". As vaccination is a medical issue, it is important that you discuss it with your own doctor.
