We are happy and thankful to you for choosing to become involved in your Parish. To help you do your job as well as you can, you should always follow our


Code of Behaviour for Children and Young People:

- Do not bring any physical item into the Church activity that may cause offence or harm to others.
- Make your own arrangements with your Parents/Guardians to get to and from the Church safely.
- Let someone know if you cannot attend.
- Attend activities on time.
- Sign in and out.
- Turn off/silence your mobile phone.
- Do not use bad language.
- Never bully anyone or send them threatening messages.
- Tell someone you trust if you feel uncomfortable with any situation or individual – do not keep it to yourself.
- If you have any worries about your role, please speak to your Parents/Guardians who will contact the Priest/Co-ordinator to discuss the matter.
